The following is a portion from the devotional book written by Bo Giertz (1905-1998), who was a bishop in the Lutheran Church of Sweden. The excerpt comes from the devotion written for the Epiphany of our Lord, which occurs on January 6, and considers the Magi who come from the east, led by the star, and who are in search of the Christ child.

It isn't only we who seek God, but God who seeks us. The wise man embody not only the hearts of men longing for God. They were able to recognize a sign in the heavens and they followed it. It turned out that God led them the right way. He guided them to Bethlehem. They were able to meet the guy who stepped out of the unknown and descended to earth and became man in order to make himself known to us. Consequently, this story tells us that God, who created all people and awakened their longing for him, also has intervened in this world with a salvation that is for all people, that answers all questions and guides all our longing to the final goal.

To be a Christian means to be a servant of God and a steward when it comes to bringing the message from God to all people. At the time in question, the wise men journey very far and spared no pains to find Jesus. Now it's the Christian churches calling to make the long journey and spare no effort to reach out to all people with the message of what happened in Bethlehem. The Gospel is for the whole world. We can't receive it without wanting to pass it on. The Light should shine and not be hidden!

Lord Jesus, I think you for your Gospel. You know that I don't want to be without it. The world would be dark and meaningless if I didn't have it. Don't allow me ever to forget those who haven't heard it. I thank you for the opportunity to help others receive the gift. I ask you to bless all those who don't have your Gospel so they may hear it. Fill us all with such joy that no one can escape noticing that we reflect you, the Light of the world and the source of all good.
